


## Making Lost Pet Reporting Easy

- Staff can search online sites
















# Maximizing Your Animal Database Cont.

- What steps can you take to increase reunification or decrease intake from these areas?







# Maximizing Your Animal Database Cont.

#### Lost & Found Matcher

- Semi-automated system
- Identify possible matches between lost and found animals
- Uses data from shelter database (Shelter Buddy) and Excel file






## Keeping Pets in the Community

#### Community Lost and Found Volunteers

- 20 scanners, operated by volunteers countywide, connect with finders via social media, NextDoor, Ring, etc.
- If a pet has a microchip, the volunteer contacts the company; if not, they provide resources to the finder

<u>HASS Tool Kits</u> provide officers with step-by-step instructions for in-field support in reuniting animals.








# Keeping Pets in the Community Using Social Media to Reunite in the Community

<u>Ring Neighbors</u> enables direct communication with residents, customizable to smaller areas.

<u>Nextdoor</u> allows municipal shelters, like Front Street Animal Shelter, to post found pets through official accounts, managed by volunteers.

<u>The Humane Society of Yuma</u> utilizes FaceBook to keep stray pets top of mind in their community.

- President conducts weekly FaceBook Lives to showcase stray animals
- Post a collection of stray animals in their shelter on FB
- Post injured animal photos on FB
